

AUDIO VISUAL PRESENTATION & RECORDING

Censorship

- All films, video tapes and CD-ROMs (originals and duplicates) which the Exhibitors intend to play during the show period must be approved by the Board of Film Censors **at least four (04) weeks** prior to the exhibition.
- The Board of Film Censors has defined a few categories of video tapes/discs which may be exempted from censorship at their discretion. Please contact the Official Forwarding & Logistics Agents. (Please refer to Page 43 for details)

Copyright Music Permit

- Exhibitors are to note that licence is required for broadcasting and public performance of music videos and karaoke videos/ laser discs in the exhibition.
- Exhibitors are advised to contact the following organisation regarding procedures for application of a "copyright" license.

- The Organiser will apply for a blanket coverage for the Copyright Music Permit to cover all Exhibitors who intend to operate any audio equipment during the exhibition. Hence, Exhibitors are not required to apply for individual music permits.

Photography & Video-Recording

- Photography and video-recording, other than those by authorised press personnel, will not be permitted. However, Exhibitors are free to photograph their own company's exhibits.
- Notwithstanding the precautionary measures taken by the Organiser, it is the Exhibitor's responsibility and in his own interest to safeguard his exhibits against unauthorised photography, sketching, filming etc.
- Exhibitors wishing to restrict photographs for any reason should place a notice to that effect adjacent to the exhibit and are advised to hire their own security guard to enforce the restriction.

Sound Levels

- Sound levels must be set at an acceptable level which causes no interference with or annoyance to other Exhibitors. The Organiser reserves the right to reduce the sound levels or restrict or switch off any audio/visual displays which causes complaints. The Organiser's decision is final if such a dispute arises.
